NEW YEAR CIRCULAR TO PARENTS, GUARDIANS AND SPONSORS

Greetings to you all and Happy New Year.

Please adhere to the outlined requirements for the new term. Classes will commence on 8th January 2024 up to 12th April 2024.

1. REPORTING ONLINE

1.1. ALL continuing students will report back to the polytechnic on Thursday 4th January 2024, register with their respective departments, and report online via the students' portal upon full payment of the prerequisite fees as reflected in their fees statements respectively. This process will remain open up to Wednesday 10th January 2024. Classes will commence on Monday 8th January 2024 at 8.00 am.

1.2. Admission for the January 2024 intake is ongoing; new students will report on Wednesday 3rd January 2024, orientation exercise will be held on Monday 8th January 2024 and classes

will commence on Tuesday 9th January 2024.

2. POLYTECHNIC FEES

2.1. The total fees payable per student for all trainees admitted under the new funding model effective from September 2023 intake is Kshs. 67,189.00 per annum; this excludes assessment fees.

2.2. The total fees payable per student for the continuing students under the old funding model is

Kshs.56, 420.00 per annum; this excludes examination fees.

2.3. All trainees are required to pay the prerequisite fees as reflected in their fees statement in full at the beginning of the term; trainees are encouraged to apply for HELB loan and/or Bursary to reduce the burden of fees.

3. ONBOARDING OF ALL TKNP SERVICES ON THE e-CITIZEN PLATFORM

- 3.1. In compliance with the Government directive to onboard all Government services on the e-Citizen platform by 31st December 2023, all payments of fees and any other services at TKNP shall be made through e-Citizen via the student portal effective January 2024. If you require any assistance please call 0723210612 or 0728139620.
- ACCOMMODATION: Affordable accommodation facilities are available on a first-come basis at Polyview Hostels, adjacent to the Polytechnic.
- 5. CATERING: The polytechnic meals are served on a Pay as You Eat system (PAYE) by the outsourced service provider.
- 6. MEDICAL: Polytechnic has a clinic where minor medical cases are attended to and first aid is offered to students. However, when a medical case is referred for further attention or hospital admission, the parent/guardian is required to take full charge and responsibility of the costs incurred.

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7. INDUSTRIAL ATTACHMENT

- 7.1. Students are required to call the Industrial Liaison Office (ILO) immediately they get placement. This will enable the Polytechnic to organize for their assessment. attachment is mandatory and commences as may be dictated by the attachment provider.
- 7.2. No student will be registered to sit KNEC Module II or III if they did not proceed for attachment at the end of training in Module I or II respectively.
- 7.3. Certificate students and Higher National Diploma students are supposed to undertake one industrial attachment while Diploma students are supposed to undertake two attachments in order to gain 330 Hours and 660 Hours respectively.

8. EXAMINATIONS

- 8.1. All students are advised to read and be conversant with the latest edition of the Academic Policy. The Policy is available in the Library and with respective Heads of Department.
- 8.2. Internal Examinations: All Students must SIT for internal examinations. The Internal Examinations at the Polytechnic will only be administered to students whose registration is up to date. All guardians/sponsors/parents are hereby notified to honor their pledges on full fee payment before the examination period.
- 8.3. External Examinations- The Kenya National Examinations Council (KNEC)
 - 8.3.1. General Information.
 - 8.3.2. Provisional examination fees are as included in the fee structures and can be downloaded from the Polytechnic website www.kisumupoly.ac.ke or the KNEC website www.knec.ac.ke. Where in doubt, do not hesitate to contact the Examination/Assessment Officer at The Kisumu National Polytechnic at 0723446773.
 - 8.3.3. Confirmation of KNEC Registration
 - KNEC confirms the registration of candidates through an SMS text. Candidates are therefore advised to provide their permanent mobile numbers to KNEC, through the examination office, for this exercise to be efficient.
 - 8.3.4. Social Work Oral Examinations: Students taking the Diploma in Social Work Module III pay an additional Kenya Shillings Three Thousand (Kshs. 3,000) for Oral Examinations.
 - 8.3.5. Exemptions: Trainees who qualify for the diploma course upon completion of the KNEC craft Certificate are exempted from the respective Diploma Module I Examinations. However, they are required to pay the equivalent Diploma Module I Examination Fees for the Diploma Certificate to KNEC before issuance of the KNEC certificate. This payment is made upon completion of module 3.
- 8.4. Kenya Accountants and Secretaries National Examinations Board (KASNEB)
- 8.4.1. KASNEB registration, KASNEB ID card, and payable fee details for every respective Programme are available at www.kasneb.or.ke or may be obtained from info@kasneb.or.ke. The Polytechnic does not process the renewal of KASNEB Registration; Trainees are therefore urged to individually process the renewal of their annual registration with KASNEB.

8.5. PROFESSIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- a) The subsidized fee for Kenya Accountants and Secretaries National Examination Board (KASNEB) and Kenya Institute of Supply Chain Professionals (KISM) programs is as Kshs. 2,000.00 per course unit for students registered in the Polytechnic per paper per level of Certified Public Accountant (CPA), Certified Secretaries (CS), Associate in Procurement and Supply of Kenya (APS-K), Certified Procurement & Supply Professional of Kenya (CPSP-K).
- b) All students taking Nutrition & Dietetics course are required to pay an additional Kshs.10,000.00 for indexing to be paid on the reporting day and KSH.2,000.00 for registration with Kenya Nutritionist and Dieticians Institute (KNDI) to be paid upon completion of the course.

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c) All students taking Pharmacy courses are required to pay an additional Kshs.9,000.00 for registration for stage1 Board examinations with Kenya Pharmacy and Poisons Board (KPPB); this is done after KNEC exams and Kshs.1, 000.00 for indexing (online).

d) All students taking Medical Laboratory Sciences are required to pay Kshs.2,500.00 for indexing and Kshs.1,200.00 for log book to the Kenya Medical Laboratory Technicians and

Technologists Board (KMLTTB).

9. ONLINE CLEARANCE: The polytechnic has adopted online clearance for students through the student portal. Students can view their fee statement and progress report and initiate clearance from their portal.

- 10. ONLINE CLASSES: All Common units are offered online; trainees are required to have a Smartphone or a Laptop for online classes.
- 11. DRIVING LESSONS: Driving classes are open to ALL students above 18 years of age, for Thirteen Thousand nine hundred and fifty Shillings only (Kshs 13,950.00) for Class B.
- 12. ENGINEERING STUDENTS: All Engineering students are expected to have a portable drawing board to take technical drawing classes. Diploma and Craft Certificate Engineering students should buy SMP tables.
- 13. STUDENT ENTERTAINMENT: Trainees will be responsible for their conduct and involvement in entertainment activities and sports outside the Polytechnic. Management will not be involved whatsoever in any incident involving the trainees and a third party during such events.
